**What Happens When Women Pray?** Would you like to gather with other women and discover what happens? Then mark your calendars for Sunday, January 16 at 9:30 a.m. when the *Women of Faith* class will gather in the Library on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor to begin a study on this classic book by Evelyn Christenson. In the chapter titled *Prayer is the Answer* Christenson writes, 'One day my husband walked out of the sanctuary of our church and encountered our custodian fairly dripping with perspiration. He was a giant of a Christian, but was gradually losing his ability to think and work effectively because of hardening of the arteries. As my husband saw him struggling with the vacuum cleaner he looked down, and there lying on the floor was the plug. The dear man had vacuumed the whole auditorium and didn't have the plug in the outlet.'

Isn't that what happens to many of us? We work, we pull, we struggle, and we plan until we're utterly exhausted, but we have forgotten to plug into the source of power. And that source of power is prayer..."

This study will stretch and challenge and

provide topics that should generate discussion, with the potential to unleash the power of prayer in one's life. Please join us, starting January 16. Books will be available at the class (\$11).

**Trinity Class to Study *Why Jesus Crossed the Road: Learning to follow the Unconventional Travel Itinerary of a First-Century Carpenter and His Ragtag Group of Friends as They Hop Fences, Cross Borders, and Generally Go Where Most People Don't* by Bruce Main.**

"Jesus traveled to places that one might not associate with a holy man or an itinerant preacher; he crossed roads and barriers that other people were afraid to cross. In a world that was governed strictly by geographical, religious, and social barriers, Jesus was audacious enough to cross the borders that kept people in safe categories. If we are completely honest, all of us have places, situations, and people whom we would rather avoid. Yet the God-following life is one committed to entering the lives and stories of all people-- a life committed to the lost spiritual discipline of border-crossing. Main shows how God can use your own "crossings" to change your life, and the lives of those whom you meet along the way."

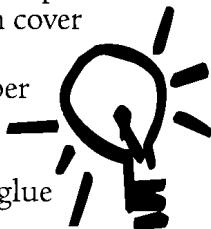


# LIGHT SWITCH COVER

Everyone who believes in God and lives for him is a child of light. Make this cover for your bedroom light switch to remind you to be a light for God.

### What you need:

- An adult to help
- Light switch cover
- Screwdriver
- Colored paper
- Markers
- Scissors
- Decoupage glue
- Paintbrush
- Craft knife



### What you do:

1. Remove the screws from the cover.
2. On the paper, draw small images related to light and write out "Live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8, NIV).
3. Cut out the drawings and verse. Make sure they'll fit on the cover.
4. Paint the cover with a coat of decoupage glue, and then immediately place the drawings and verse on the cover.
5. Paint over them with another coat of glue. Let it dry.
6. Turn the cover over and use a craft knife to cut out the opening for the light switch.
7. Using a screwdriver, place your new light switch cover on your wall.

**Pledges Help Us Reach our 2011 Goals** We want to thank everyone who submitted a pledge card for 2011. To date, we have received pledges to support our budget at a total of \$221,923. With that figure, we can now put the finishing touches on the 2011 budget which will be approved by Administrative Council at January 31 meeting. Once it is approved, it will be available for all to see.

### **Year-End Report of our 2<sup>nd</sup> Mile Giving Categories:**

**Food Pantry** – Goal \$2,000 – received \$3,073 - **Goal Surpassed by \$1,073!**

**Habitat for Humanity** – Goal \$3,500 – received \$1,815.46

**Hope and Possibilities** – Goal \$1,500 – received \$1,734.31– **Goal Surpassed by \$234.31!**

**PET Project** – Goal \$2,000 – received \$960

While we didn't reach our goal of \$3,500 for Habitat for Humanity, you really stepped up during the last few weeks of 2010, contributing almost \$1,000 above what had been given as of mid November.

**Holiday Offerings bring in \$5,614** We thank all who contributed to the Thanksgiving Offering, which brought in \$2,069, and the Christmas Offering, which brought in \$3,545. Both offerings exceeded our expectations and will reach out to help others!

## **From Our Friends at Good Works Inc.:**

**Do You Know Someone Who Might Consider Donating A Car to Good Works?** We need cars. There are 130 people on the waiting list right now to participate in our Transformation Station. So far, we have provided 79 cars to families here in Athens County where 30% of the people live under the poverty line, the most in the State of Ohio. The TS is a "sweat equity" volunteer program where people who need cars volunteer their time to help others in our Athens County and receive points in exchange for their service. They use their points to buy cars (and appliances). The program is now 6 years old.

**We Are Seeking Groups to Sponsor One of Our Friday Night Suppers in 2011.** Sponsoring groups provide a meal for about 100-130 people on ONE Friday Night this year. Events take place at The Plains United Methodist Church through March and

then move to the Good Works Luhrig Road property for the spring and summer. Sponsoring groups come from 4:00 pm until 8:00 pm on the Friday of your choice. Sponsoring group sizes are usually not less than 7 and not more than 14. Contact us by e-mail or at 740.594.3339 for more information.
